Abstract

The research includes literature and eloquence of the Holy Qur'an, in this thesis word *Adab* and *Balagha* have been discussed. The types, purpose and composition of the language of Holy Quran are also discussed. Moreover, the importance and advantages of literature and eloquence in Arabic language was studied. The compilation and arrangement of the Holy Qur'an, and stages of completion and, difference names of the Holy Qur'an were discussed.

It is said that the examples given in the Holy Qur'an are extremely beneficial for the mankind and this is the book of guidance and a code of life, and the reason behind giving examples in the Holy Qur'an is to call the mankind to the righteous way.

In one sense the examples given in the Holy Qur'an are the means of calling the mankind to think about their purpose of creation and in other sense the Qur'anic examples are having eloquence, simile, analogy, metaphor, figure of speech, metonymy, brevity, all idiomatic expressions etc.

In this study twenty five examples of the Holy Qur'an, beginning from Surat al-Baqarah to Surat al-Kahf have been discussed and classified the examples into two categories, first which is having resemblance to the examples presented in the Arabic literature, second the examples which are not in resemblance with the examples already existed in the Arabic literature.
