### Launch of the Jamia e-Governance Services

(October 31, 2008)

Commemorating the 88<sup>th</sup> Foundation Week Celebrations of Jamia Millia Islamia, the FTK-Centre for Information Technology dedicated three more e-Governance services to the University on October 31, 2008. The newly created services were targeted to empower employees by proving information relevant to them at their desks. With the launch of these services the employees will now have

the facility to generate the following reports on their desktops/laptops:

- Salary slips
- Salary ledger
- PF/GPF subscription statement
- Loan deduction and other income statements
- Form16
- Leave records

The departments have also been provided the facility of uploading Notices/Circulars/Tenders etc. on the University website. Another facility that allows employees to register complaints, track status, and evaluate the services was also launched. The Complaint Management System will initially be implemented for managing the activities of the University's IT Help Desk and later it will be used

for the University's other services as well. Prof. Zahid H. Khan, Director, FTK-CIT, while addressing the audience, said that the objective of the new services is to bring transparency, efficiency and accountability in the system.

Mr. T.A.Khan, Deputy Director General, National Informatics Centre, Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, Government of India while declaring the services open, appreciated the efforts of the FTK-Centre for Information Technology in automating the functioning of the University. He expressed happiness in noting that IT in Jamia is far ahead of many other universities in the country. He urged the centre to keep up the good work. Mr. T.A. Khan also talked about the challenges for further evolution of the services. Some specific suggestions given by Mr. Khan, included implementation of work flow for managing leaves, net payments and implementation of e-Procurement System. He also emphasized the importance of data security in automation.

Mr Syed Shahid Mahdi, Former Vice-Chancellor of Jamia Millia Islamia was the guest of honour. He expressed satisfaction on the progress shown by the FTK-Centre for Information Technology. In his address, Mr. Mahdi emphasized that for effective e-governance the existing processes must be reviewed and streamlined. He further argued that ICT should be used as an enabling tool on carefully engineered processes only for effective e-governance. He noted that the potential of ICT is not being fully exploited in teaching and learning. Mr. Mahdi envisioned effective application of ICT in language teaching and distance learning.

## Extension Lecture on “Exact Sciences in Medieval India: A Brief Survey of Resources”

An Extension lecture on “Exact Sciences in Medieval India: A Brief Survey of Resources” was delivered by a well known scholar Prof. SM Razaullah Ansari, President of the International Union of History and Philosophy of Science (IUHPS). The lecture was held on November 1, 2008 at the Conference Hall, FTK-Centre

for Information Technology on the occasion of the Natural Science Info Fest – 2008 . It was attended by faculty members, research scholars and students of the Faculty of Natural Sciences and also some faculty members from other departments of Jamia. The lecture was based on the literature survey of Arabic and Persian resources. Highlighting the achievements of scientists during the

medieval period in India, Prof. Ansari emphasized that due recognition and importance be given to the medieval and even other resources of science. He further suggested that for deeper understanding and research of this multi-disciplinary area, institutions like Jamia Millia Islamia should take a lead by providing a collaborative platform for scholars of science and languages to understand and analyze historical resources.

**Dr. S.M.R. Ansari**

Did his D. Sc. (Dr. rer. nat.) from Eberhard Karl University at Tübingen (Germany). He has been a Fellow of Alexander von Humboldt Foundation (Bonn). He joined Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh (India) in 1970, became a full Professor in 1984 and retired in 1994.

He has been holding a number of international offices:

- President of IUHPS Commission for Science and Technology in Islamic Civilisation (1993-1997),
- President of IUHPS-IAU Joint Inter-Union Commission for History of Astronomy (1997-2001),
- President of the IAU Commission for History of Astronomy (1994-97).
- President of the IUHPS Commission for History of Ancient and Medieval Astronomy (2001- 2005).
- Re-elected as President of the IUHPS Commission for History of Ancient and Medieval Astronomy (2005-2009).

Dr. Ansari has to his credit about 70 research papers. He has made valuable contributions in the field of History of Oriental Astronomy and History of Science and Technology in the Islamic World. Furthermore, he is a Contributor to the Encyclopaedia Islamica, published by Islamic Foundation, Tehran.

Dr. Ansari is also involved in various international projects, including those sponsored by UNESCO.

**National Workshop on “Web 2.0 in Education”**

( November 4, 2008 )

A National Workshop on “**Web 2.0 in Education**” was organized at FTK-Centre for Information Technology on November 4, 2008. About 80 participants from five different states attended the workshop. The workshop was inaugurated

In his inaugural address, Prof. Dongaonkar emphasized the role of technology in everyday life and observed that affinity of masses towards ICT and its applications in India has brought

due recognition to the country. Mr. Mahdi described the benefits of Web 2.0 in educational institutions and stressed upon the need of making

people aware of the recent developments in technology by setting “institution of excellence”. Prof. Z. H. Khan, Hony. Director of the FTK-CIT welcomed the chief guest, all other dignitaries and participants and described the major achievements made by the center in last eight years.

Prof. S.M.R. Ansari, President, International Union of History and Philosophy of Science (IUHPS), chaired the first technical session of the workshop. Dr. Vijay Srivastava, Head of the Computer Centre, Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) delivered a very informative talk on “Web 2.0 in Distance Education”. Prof. Ashok Kumar Bakhshi, Director, Institute of Lifelong Learning, University of Delhi gave a presentation on “E-learning in Higher Education: A Chemist’s Perspective”. Ms. Jayalakshmi Chittoor, Programme Coordinator, Centre for Science Development and Media Studies (CSDMS), Noida, gave a lively talk on “Exploring Web 2.0 Tools for Adaptation by

Students for Education". The session chair Prof. Ansari while summing up the session emphasized the need of "critical thinking".

Prof. Mohd Miyan, Director, Centre for Distance and Open Learning chaired the second technical session of the

workshop. Prof. Z. H. Khan, Hony. Director, FTK-CIT gave a presentation on "Web 2.0 and Its Application". Presenting the characteristics of Web 2.0, Prof. Khan gave a beautiful description of "Podcasting" and its relevance in education. Ms. Swati Samaddar, Regional Head, Educational Sales, Adobe India gave a very interesting presentation on "Web 2.0 in Education: Educate with Confidence". She introduced the various Web 2.0 based Adobe tools and discussed their applications and effectiveness in teaching and learning.

The third Technical session of the workshop was chaired by Prof. Ahrar Husain, Head, Department of Teachers Training and Non-Formal Education, Jamia Millia Islamia. Mr. Aniruddha Batchu, Product Manager, SQL Star International, Hyderabad narrated his experiences of managing a learning portal during his talk on "Significance of Technology in an Applied Learning Environment". A presentation on "Creating Virtual Classrooms using Adobe Connect" was given by Mr. Muzaffar Azim, System Analyst, FTK-CIT. He explained the concept of Virtual Classrooms and its features and advantages



over traditional classrooms. He also gave a demonstration of "Adobe Connect Presenter", which is a tool for Content Management System and on "Adobe Connect Training". The last presentation in this session was given by Dr. S. Kazim Naqvi, Sr. System Analyst, FTK-CIT on "Open Source Course Management System". Dr. Naqvi, advocated the use of Open Source Tools in teaching and learning environment. He also discussed about "Moodle" a popular Open Source Course Management System.

The closing session of the Workshop was chaired by Prof. Farida Abdullah Khan, Dean, Faculty of Education, JMI. Dr. Khurram Mustafa, Head, Computer Science Department was as an invited expert reviewer. Dr. Mustafa emphasized the need of technology adoption by the teachers in teaching and learning process and suggested that Web 2.0 based tools should be taken as

(December 1-5, 2008)







## FTK-CIT hosts the CSIT Track of XXXII Indian Social Science Congress

(18-20 December 2008)

The FTK-Centre for Information Technology, Jamia Millia Islamia hosted the programmes conducted by the Computer Science and Information Technology Research Committee (CSIT) of the XXXII Indian Social Science Congress. The programs were organized on 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of December 2008 at the Conference Hall of the Centre. The inaugural program of the CSIT track was held on 18<sup>th</sup> Dec. 2008 and began with the welcome address by the Co-Convener of the CSIT track, Dr. S. Kazim Naqvi. The inaugural address of the track was delivered by Prof. Jitendra Shah, Chairperson, CSIT. Prof. Shah introduced the delegates of the Congress to the objectives of the CSIT track and highlighted the importance of perceiving the ICT as a tool for social change. Drawing upon his vast experience in area of ICT applications, he encouraged the participants to undertake research with a view to help society. Dr. SAM Rizvi, Convener CSIT also addressed the delegates and made a very exciting presentation on “Emerging Technologies (GRAIN) in India’s National Development”. On the second day, Dr. Ravinder, Statistician, SPSS Bangalore gave a talk on “SPSS for Social Scientists”. The talk was accompanied by a comprehensive demonstration of the SPSS package. On the third day, Ms. Simin Naqvi, Delhi University delivered a lecture on “E-Views Applications in Social Sciences”. In addition to the delegates of the Congress, both the sessions were attended by a large number of students from Department of Computer Science, Psychology and Economics. Twelve research papers were also presented in the CSIT Track of the Congress which included the following contribution from FTK-CIT:




## Profiles/CVs

## Online Alumni Module

The Jamia Online Alumni module is basically a facility providing information about Jamia Alumni who register themselves using online registrations. It can be accessed through the URL, <http://jmi.ac.in/alumni/index.php>

The module has three options. The first option is for the New User (as shown on top of the picture), who want to register for the first time. The second option is meant for those who have already registered but want to edit their profile. They have simply to “Login” by entering their “User name” and “Password”. The third option is to surf and share the information about other alumni by clicking “Browse Jamia Alumni”.

For registering your profile in this website, click the New User link. You will find a Registration Form which has got about 40 fields out of which some are mandatory to be filled. It is important to note that all mandatory fields must be filled up before clicking the submit button.

There is also a provision for uploading your photograph in this registration form for which you have simply to click the browse button to select the file. Then click the upload button and your photograph will be uploaded.




### Wi-Fi Usage in Jamia picks up

The FTK-CIT has started Wi-Fi internet connectivity in and around a number of buildings in Jamia. For security purposes, the Centre implemented a scheme under which all WiFi Internet users are registered for which accounts are activated for their users. The scheme for Registration was started on 10 October 2008. Upto December 2008, 122 accounts have been created and activated for Internet access using Wi-Fi. The department-wise and gender-wise break-up of WiFi users is shown below:






## Virus Attacks on the Jamia Internet Gateway during 2008



## Internet Browsing in Jamia



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### Enhancement of Internet Bandwidth and its Utilization


In October 2008, an additional 2 Mbps (1:1) bandwidth through Radio Link from ERNET India was acquired, thus enhancing it to 8 Mbps. The Internet connectivity of 2 Mbps bandwidth through leased line and 2 mbps from Radio Link from ERNET, India, and another 2+2 Mbps Internet Connectivity through Radio Link installed through STPI.
