Jamia Millia to get a new interactive portal

NEW DELHI: Jamia Millia Islamia will soon have a new interactive and dynamic portal which is being developed by the Indo-Asian New Service

with a number of useful features for students, teachers and the university administration.

According to jamia FTK Centre for Information Technology director Prof. Zahid Hussain Khan, the portal will be different

from the existing website as it will be dynamic and will incorporate a host of interactive features. "It will facilitate online admissions through online admission form. Compared to a website which is static, a portal is dynamic and has many possibilities," he added.

The portal will further provide appropriate plug-ins to integrate with jamia's existing Management Information system. This implies that the student module, accounts and finance modules, the

examination module and other modules will be accessible from the portal. Further, teachers will be able to assess the portal and personally feed in their inputs. The portal will use an open source learning management system which enables useful features like developing and modifying courses.

Features

Moreover university employees will be able to access details of their current and previous salaries

income tax details and loan information. The portal will support web2.0 technologies; for instance, RSS feeds, blogs, chats and podcasts. Students will be a provision for online chatting too.

The portal will also be securely integrated with a payment gateway to enable jamia to receive e-payments for prospectuses and application form, tuition fees and other dues. However, students might have to wait for some time

to access the e-payment facility as the portal is expected to be functional only next June.

"We are planning to release the admission prospectus as early as January 2011 which means the admission procedure will finish earlier. Hence the e-payment facility and also the online admissions feature will not be used till 2012. Besides, developing a secure e-payment facility takes time," Prof. Khan said.



- Action on the file is taken by the SC-ST Cell and Establishment Branch and it is finally closed on 5th November 2010.









Visits to Jamia Website


Website Visits during Q4/2010

During the fourth quarter of the year, there were 2,03,976 unique visitors to the website and the total number of web hits during the same period was 4,39,116. A detailed monthly break up of the web hits and unique visitors to the Jamia website is displayed in the following graph.



Quarterly Website Visits


There were a total of 2,693,567 unique visitors to the Jamia website during 2010. A quarterly graphical representation for each quarter is given in the following:



From the above graph it is obvious that the largest number of visitors (43%) were in the second quarter, followed by 22% in the third quarter. This is well understandable since after the notification of admissions and display of prospectus and application forms, the website has the largest visits during the months April to June.

Website Visits from Different Continents

According to the statistics obtained from www.sitemeter.com, a break-up of visitors to the Jamia website from various continents of the world during 2010 is shown in the following graph:

It is obvious from the above graph that 51% of visitors during 2010 were from Asia and 49% from rest of the world.



Network Expansion and WiFi Services


Connectivity Restoration/Alteration
