Khoj will host Mohd. Intiyaz, from 20th May, 2019 - 23rd June, 2019...

Khoj will provide for Mohd. Intiyaz, (hereafter 'the artist'):

- A PRODUCTION BUDGET not exceeding INR 15000 (Fifteen Thousand only) to 'the artist' towards material, production, installation and dismantling costs after deducting statutory taxes as applicable and against invoices provided by 'the artist'.
- 2. All invoices should be in the name of Khoj International Artists Association. Please consider all budgets carefully as any costs incurred above this amount shall be borne by you (the artist).
- 3. A per-diem of a total amount of INR 15000 (Fifteen thousand only) to 'the artist' to cover day-to-day expenses towards food and local transport for the duration of his/her stay.
- 4. Practical Support enabling the production and installation of 'the Work'.
- 5. Organizing the Opening of 'the Work', including invitations, PR and hosting a small party.
