Abstract of the Concept Note

This conference seeks to explore the multifaceted and often debated relationship between Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, India's first Deputy Prime Minister, and the Indian Muslim community. Celebrated as the 'Iron Man' for his monumental achievement of integrating over 560 princely states, Patel's legacy is also deeply intertwined with the tumultuous period of Partition.

Initially a great proponent of Hindu-Muslim unity, Patel's stance evolved into staunch opposition against the Muslim League's Two-Nation Theory, which he saw as a threat to India's integrity. In the violent aftermath of Partition, his role as Home Minister drew criticism from contemporaries who accused him of an anti-Muslim bias due to his firm policies and blunt rhetoric. However, Patel consistently differentiated his opposition to separatist politics from his duty to the Muslim community, taking decisive action against rioters of all faiths to restore order.

Historical accounts reveal a complex statesman who demanded unwavering loyalty from Muslims who chose India, while simultaneously playing a pivotal role in embedding secularism and minority rights into the Constitution. He firmly resisted calls to declare India a Hindu state. This conference proposes a critical examination of Patel's actions, moving beyond simplistic narratives to understand his policies through the primary lens of his unwavering, and at times severe, commitment to the unity and security of the nascent Indian nation.
