About the Course:

This course aims to prepare a new generation of researchers who understand that the global order is increasingly being formulated in terms of countries and perspectives outside of the traditional West. In the wake of India's emergence as a thought leader in the Global South, its historical linkages and strategic depth in West Asia, Central Asia and North Africa, and its growing influence on global norms, it is essential to examine IR through the uniquely Indian lens.

About the University

Jamia Millia Islamia, a Public Central University; established in 1920, originally at Aligarh in United Provinces which in 1925 initially moved to Karol Bagh, Delhi and later built up in Jamia Nagar. In 1988, it became the Central University by an Act of Parliament and since then it is expanding in different directions achieving the new dimensions.

About the Centre for West Asian Studies

The Centre for West Asian Studies was established in July 2004 and formally inaugurated by Dr. Manmohan Singh, the Prime Minister of India, on 29 January 2005. It is part of the institution founded under a programme of the research and development initiated by the Jamia Millia Islamia, a university steeped in secular values and ideas. The scope of the studies includes all the countries of West Asia including Turkey. India has always had multifaceted relations with peoples of the region.

The Centre seeks to foster interdisciplinary academic pursuit of the West Asia and promote research on the region's politics, economics, culture and its relations with India as well as its interconnections to a larger global milieu. It aims to provide a forum for informed exchange of ideas among students, faculty, and scholars from outside, and serve as a niche for public policy studies. It equally aims to generate and provide resources through which the interested and expert alike, can understand a region which has close and historic cultural, economic and religious links with India. It also seeks to promote an Indian perspective on developments in the region, especially those which equally impinge on global peace, security and development.

The Centre admits students in P.G. and Ph.D programmes for two and five years, respectively. The educational objective of the Centre is to impart specialist knowledge of the region to its students, in order to enable them to pursue careers in research and teaching, journalism, business, government and non-governmental organisations, and others. As West Asia becomes an increasingly important region for India and the wider world, the Centre is expected to excel with newer research and taught courses. It remains committed to deepening knowledge of the region through rigorous teaching, innovative research, and essential language-learning modules.

Objective of the course

The proposed course aims to empower research scholars by providing comprehensive training in the theoretical, philosophical, and practical aspects of research across various disciplines. It seeks to equip participants with the necessary skills to identify research problems, formulate hypotheses, and design methodologically sound research proposals. The course will offer hands-on experience in both qualitative and quantitative data collection methods, using appropriate tools and techniques for data analysis. Additionally, it will focus on enhancing academic writing skills for preparing research proposals and scholarly papers suitable for publication in high-impact journals. A critical component of the course is to deepen the participants' understanding of research ethics, with particular emphasis on reference management and plagiarism detection

Course Structure and Content

The ten-day Research Methodology Course will be conducted through a structured blend of lectures, interactive sessions, and hands- on training to provide a comprehensive learning experience. It will begin with the fundamentals of research, including its objectives, types, approaches, and methods for identifying and formulating research problems. Participants will learn the essentials of research design, such as topic selection, literature review, and proposal writing. Emphasis will be given to both qualitative and quantitative research methods, including interviews, surveys, sampling, and fieldwork. The course will also cover data analysis using tools like Tableau and R for various statistical techniques. Sessions on academic writing will help participants craft research papers, reports, and proposals while focusing on ethical writing and publication strategies. The course will further introduce essential research tools such as plagiarism detection software (Ouriginal, Turnitin) and reference managers (EndNote, Mendeley, Zotero) to promote ethical and organized research practices

Learning Outcomes and Expected Impact

Upon completing the course, participants will be able to design and execute scientifically robust research projects, demonstrating proficiency in both qualitative and quantitative data analysis techniques. They will understand and apply ethical principles throughout the research process, including proper reference management and plagiarism avoidance. Additionally, they will acquire advanced academic writing skills for drafting high-quality manuscripts and research proposals, and will gain confidence in utilizing technological tools for data management, plagiarism detection, and reference organization, thereby significantly enhancing their overall research competence and professional impact.
