## A Report on VIGILANCE AWARENESS WEEK "Vigilant India, Prosperous India" (27th October to 2nd November 2020)

As a part of observing Vigilance Awareness Week (VAW) 2020 during October 27 – November 2, 2020, **the Department of Tourism and Hospitality Management, Jamia Millia Islamia** enthusiastically spread awareness amongst students through various interactive activities and events. Students enrolled in different programmes of the Department participated in the contests and displayed their artistic and academic skills. The principal objective of event was to enhance knowledge and awareness with along with enhancing creativity amongst the students by promoting expression of their ideas using the colours of imagination, knowledge, and skills. Amidst the pandemic situation, the presentation of posters was through online mode and each participant was giving ten minutes to present his/her piece of work.

It inspired them to think and to work creatively in order to promote artistic excellence. The creativity & innovative ideas to resolve the particular issue were artistically presented through and captured in posters. 

### Virtual Debate

As part of the VAW, a virtual debate titled, 'Battle of Minds' was organised to encourage a brainstorming and aware culture amongst the students.


The topic of the debate was in sync with the national theme of VAW. The pan India theme for WAS this year is 'Satark Bharat, Samriddh Bharat' (Vigilant India, Prosperous India). In the same lines, the



topic of the debate was, "The elimination of corruption lies in the hands of the citizens more than the government". Four students spoke for the topic and four students spoke against the topic. They very efficiently raised points that highlighted the role of citizens in blowing the whistle against any wrong doing in public, the introduction of bills such as

Right to Information due to public protest amongst other examples. The argument against the topic advocated the paramount role of government in maintaining law, order and justice in the society. Both the sides with utmost diligence put forth their stand.

Judge professor Nimit R Chowdhary along with the Head of the Department, Dr. Sarah Hussain provided students with important lessons for future and encouraged their future participation. Kartik Sharma backed the second position while Kavya Vijay was awarded first. Being one of the first kind of debates for DTHM, the enthusiasm and zeal amongst the students and faculty members helped in making it a success and a precedent for future debating culture. Such an atmosphere allows exposure and development of new thoughts among student.



### **Essay Writing Competition**

#### (31/10/2020)

The Department also organized an offline competition on Essay Writing. The theme of the event was: Women Rights' Awareness. The essays submitted by students emphasized the concern on how women in India and abroad are often deprived of their basic rights even in the 21st century. The essays evidently mentioned the leaders from history who stood for women rights, and the contemporary leaders such as Malala Yousafzai, Angela Merkel, Indira Nooyi etc. who are creating a space for women in both the political and economic world. The essays were creatively written and adorned with beautiful pictures, and mentioned explicitly that awareness starts from home. Further, the students critically analysed the increasing number of crimes, violence, gender gap, and low literacy rate among women in India in spite of several policies introduced by the government. The essays were judged on the basis of the writing style and structure, creativity, grammar, and originality. Accordingly, the event was won by two students- Syed Mohammaed Huzaif and Jyoti Panwar from under-graduate programmes in the department.

### Online –Quiz (01/11/2020)


