CONCEPT NOTE:

From the time immemorial, India and the countries of West Asia and North Africa (WANA) have been in constant interconnection with the exchange of knowledge, goods, ideas, and cultures. At this end of history, Indo-Arab relations have been on a distinctive trajectory with the massive movement of people from India to the Arab world and vice versa in the form of pilgrimage or labor migration. A large number of Indian expatriates in different parts of the region are the best example of sound relation between the two regions.

In the back drop of popular uprisings in the Arab world, the region has witnessed a great sociopolitical unrest. Historically, this region has remained a volatile one because of its many internal
as well as regional issues, and remained the most happening place in many contexts. It has the
privilege to be the cradle of civilization and the birth place of the most influential religions
namely Islam. Christianity and Judaism. Ironically, the geo-strategic importance, enormous
energy reservoirs and historical background of West Asia have been the curse for this region; all
these have also incited and motivated several foreign invasions and forceful occupations in this
region.

This two-day National seminar is an attempt to understand different aspects of Indo-Arab relations and to analyze interconnections as well future prospects in reviving socio-economic ties. There is a need for exchange of ideas and approaches at intellectual level. The conference will also focus on India's role in socio-Political affairs of the Arab world in view to protect its oil and gas needs and the aspirations of a large number of Indian expatriates living in the region.

The West Asia region plays a vital role in India's economy as it supplies nearly two third of India's total oil import, bilateral trade is also flourishing in recent years particularly with UAE and other Arab states of the Persian Gulf. Over the years millions of Indians mostly working class have migrated to the Persian Gulf region looking for jobs and they account for a sizeable share in the total remittances received from abroad that has changed the living standards and economic status of many families here in India. In recent years, we see a sudden decline in the

flow of migrant laborers and foreign relations with the Arab World; therefore it is very important matter to study and contribute in policy making accordingly.

- 11. Islamic Art and Crafts in India: Architectural importance.
- 12. India and the Arab Culture: Language, Art, Science, Music, Dance and Popular Culture.
- 13. India's Economic and Political interest in West Asia.
- 14. Relations between India and Saudi Arabia, UAE, Israel, Palestine, Turkey etc.
