Memories from the underdevelopment/1968/104min



Memories of Underdevelopment is based on Edmundo Desnoe's novel Inconsolable Memories. The story takes place during a transitory period in Cuba, between the Bay of Pigs invasion in 1961 and the Cuban Missile Crisis in 1962, events to which the film makes direct reference by using fragments of newsreels, recording of speeches, filming with hidden camera

Last supper/1976/112min



A dark parody set in 18th century Cuba about what happens when one man carries out his idea of the Christian ideal in the very non-Christian context of slavery. When a wealthy plantation owner decides to follow Christ's example by washing the feet of twelve of his slaves, the angry "apostles", who share neither the boss's wealth nor his religion, rebel. They set fire to the crops and flee, and soon the owner, furious at the destruction of both his land and his little drama, orders the slaves found and killed... One of the masterpieces of

revolutionary Cuban cinema.

Death of a bureaucrat/1966/87min



The Cuban Death of A Bureaucrat involves the demise of an inventor, who had developed a machine to mass-produce statuettes of Cuban hero Jose Martin. Unfortunately, the inventor is buried with his union card in his pocket. Unable to collect any pension money without that card, the widow attempts to exhume the body. Her hands tied by red tape, the widow is forced to rob her husband's grave.


Sunday, August 24/11.00 a m

The story, set in 1979, concerns the relationship that gradually develops between the flamboyantly gay Diego and a very young, politically committed university student, David. David feels threatened by Diego's openly frank homosexuality as much as he is threatened by what he senses could be Diego's rejection of revolutionary ideas.

Twelve Chairs/1962/93 mins/

When Hipolito (Enrique Saniesteban) hears that his dying mother-in-law has left a fortune in jewels stashed away in one of her dozen imported chairs, he determines to find the missing fortune. This 1962 film directed by Tomás Gutiérrez Alea and adapted by Alea and Ugo Ulive from Petrov and IIf's popular Russian novel of the same name, the action is here transplanted from Tsarist Russia to post-Revolutionary Cuba.
