

# **SCHOLARSHIP ALERT**

## **THE EMERGING MARKETS SCHOLARSHIP**

HRH Prince Michael of Kent has partnered with London School of Business & Finance (LSBF) to create the Emerging Markets Scholarship. This specialized scholarship scheme gives candidates from emerging markets the chance to study a degree in London with funding ranging from £1000-£8000. The awards are available for BIB (Bachelor of Arts, International Business), MBA, MBA+ professional qualification (ACCA, CIMA, CFA, CIM0, MIB (Master in International Business), MIB + professional qualification (ACCA, CIMA, CFA, CIM), MSc Finance, MSc Investment Banking & Securities, MSc in Finance & Investment Management, MSc in M&A and Corporate Restructuring, MSc in Pension & Fund Management and MSc Digital Marketing. The Emerging Marketing scholarship are awarded only in the form of a reduction in tuition fees payable to LSBF and do not include a contribution towards living costs, travel or other expenses.

**Requirements:** Applicants must show a proven history of academic excellence; meet the English requirements of the programme they are applying for provide proof of funds to pay the remaining course fees; must have already applied for a programme at LSBF; must be classified as an international student and not residing in the UK and be a national of one of the emerging markets listed on the website (includes India).

**Submission:** Scholarships are awarded in a rolling basis, but you will have to ensure your application has been received by LSBF before January 29, 2010 for Spring intake.

## **FELIX SCHOLARSHIPS 2010**

Up to six Felix Scholarships will be available to first class Indian students to pursue graduate studies at the School of Oriental and African Studies. The programme could be any full-time Taught Master's or MPhil/Ph. D. The scholarship covers the cost of tuition fees at the International rate and provides around £11,700 for living expenses. The Felix scholarships now have their own website ([www.felixscholarship.org](http://www.felixscholarship.org))

**Requirements:** The candidate should be under 30 years of age on January 31; demonstrate financial need; possess at least a first-class honours degree from a university or comparable institution. Those applying for an MPhil/Ph.D must also possess a good Master's degree from a university or comparable institution. Candidates who already hold a degree from a university outside their country are not eligible to apply. Graduates are expected to return to work in their home country. Only those who have been accepted for admission by January 29 will be considered for shortlisting.

## **LAMFALUSSY RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP**

The Lamfulussy Research Fellowship by the European Central Bank aims to promote quality research on the structure; integration and performance of the European financial (see [eu-financial-system.org](http://eu-financial-system.org)). There are five scholarships in 2010 (10,000 euros). The successful candidate will be required to write a research paper during 2010 in suggested areas (refer to [www.ecb.europa.eu/pub/fsr/html/index.en.html](http://www.ecb.europa.eu/pub/fsr/html/index.en.html)).

**Requirements:** Applicants should not be more than 36 years old at the time of submission. Researchers at assistant professor level and very advanced Ph. **To apply:** Applications should be submitted in English and include a cover letter, curriculum vitae, two letters of recommendation and a two-page research proposal falling under one of the topics mentioned. They should also contain a statement concerning the candidate's current sources of funding.
