5. Interdisciplinary Programs and Departments involved:

The Centre is involved in a wide range of disciplines such as Conflict Studies, Peace and Development, International Relations, Security, Environment, Governance, Laws, Healthcare, Gender Issues, History and Literature with specific focus on North East of India. Have organised programs in collaboration with Department of History, Geography, Sarojini Naidu Centre for Women's Studies, Nelson Mandela Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution and AJK Mass Communication and Research Centre.

6. Courses in collaboration with other universities, industries, foreign institutions, etc.:

a. Colloquium of historians to develop curricula on North East History for Universities and Colleges across India: Thirty five historians representing North Eastern universities and from other parts of the country attended a two day workshop to develop the history paper on the History of North East India as a possible unit/part of the history course in Central Universities. at the Indian Council of Social Science Research-North East Regional Centre, Shillong, and funded by National Book Trust. A draft framework is to be finalized in the next meeting (tentatively scheduled to be held in March 2015 in New Delhi.

b. A 2-week exchange programme with 10 Indian, 10 Bangladeshi and 2 Nepali participants was held at Sunderbans and Kolkata in India and Dhaka, Bangladesh in collaboration with IUCN and MAKAIAS from 26 October to 7 November, 2014.

c. Collaborated with National Book Trust, New Delhi and Indian Council of Social Science Research-North East Regional Centre, Shillong in organising a colloquium of historians from North East India to develop curricula for Universities and Colleges across the country (27-28 August, 2014).

d. A 2-week exchange programme with 10 Indian and 10 Bangladeshi participants was held at Guwahati, India and Dhaka, Bangladesh 14-27, November 2013 in collaboration with IUCN and University of Dhaka.
