ORDER

WHEREAS, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (2) of Section 32 of the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993 (73 of 1993) and in supersession of the National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2009, the National Council for Teacher Education has notified the Regulations, 2014 on 01.12.2014.

2. AND WHEREAS, the recognition was granted by NRC to Department of Educational Studies, Faculty of Education, Jamia Millia Islamia, Jamia Nagar, State - New Delhi-110025 for M.Ed. Course vide order No. F. No. F-3/DH-112/2000/687-691 dated 24.04.2000 with an annual intake of 20 seats, increased taken on to 35 seats.

3. AND WHEREAS, the institution Department of Educational Studies, Faculty of Education, Jamia Millia Islamia, Jamia Nagar, State - New Delhi-110025 has by affidavit consented to come under New Regulations and sought for one basic unit in M.Ed., which require additional facilities.

4. AND WHEREAS, it has been decided to permit the institution to have one basic unit of 50 students subject to the institution fulfilling following conditions namely.

- (i) The institution shall create additional facilities that include (a) additional built-up-area, (b) additional infrastructure, (c) additional funds, (d) adhere to staff norms as per Regulations, 2014 and inform Regional Committees with required documents by October 31, 2015.
- (ii) The application-Institution for additional unit will be required to submit the required documents such as land documents, Encumbrance Certificate (EC), Land Use Certificate (LUC) and the Building Plan (BP) in the specified proforma available on the website to the Regional Committee in proof of having provided additional facilities before October 31, 2015. Building completion Certificate (BCC) may be given along with other documents if available, otherwise it can also be given to the Visiting Team at the time of inspection.
- (iii) The Regional Committees shall arrange for verification of documents, inspection of these premises and check adherence to these condition by 20 February, 2016. If it is found by the Regional Committee that the institution fails to comply with these requirements, the institutions shall not be permitted to admit students for the academic year 2016-2017.
- (iv) In case any existing institution's matter is sub-judice under court direction/SCN under section 17 of the NCTE Act/ Complaint etc., the institution shall be required to submit a copy of the Hon'ble Court order/reply to SCN/complaint/already submitted alongwith the documents, if any together the documents referred above. In case the institution's request for shifting of premises is pending, such institution shall be required to submit the requisite documents as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 with a copy of the order/NOC of the affiliating body/State Govt. and such other documents as indicated in the revised format recognition order. The final decision shall be subject to the directions given by the Hon'ble Court in the Writ Petition/case decided by the Northern Regional Committee in respect of Section 17/complaint cases etc.

5. Now therefore, in the light of the above, the Northern Regional Committee, NCTE hereby issues the revised Recognition Order to Department of Educational Studies, Faculty of Education, Jamia Millia Islamia, Jamia Nagar, State - New Delhi-110025 for conducting M.Ed. programme of two years duration with an annual intake of 50 for one basic unit of 50 students from the academic session 2015-2016 subject to fulfillment of the conditions mentioned herein before 31.10.2015.

6. Further, the recognition is subject to fulfillment of all such other requirements as may be prescribed by other regulatory bodies like UGC, affiliating University/ Body, State Government etc. as applicable. The affiliating body (University/State Govt.) shall also be required to verify the authenticity of the land & building documents as well as appointment of requisite teaching & non-teaching staff as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 by the concerned institution before grant of affiliation to an institution.

7. The institution shall submit to the Regional Committee a Self-Appraisal Report at the end of each academic year along with the statement of annual accounts duly audited by a Chartered Accountant.

Dear Vice Chancellor:

Please refer to my DO letter No.51-4/2014/NCTE/N&S dated 16.12.2014 informing therein about notification of National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition of Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014 on 28.11.2014.


2. In pursuance of the above said Regulations, applications have been invited (from 01.03.2015 to 31.05.2015) from the States / UTs for Teacher Education Programmes. As per the new Regulations, one of the important documents i.e. No Objection Certificate issued by the concerned Affiliating Body is required to be submitted by the applicant institution along with the application. The provisions of NOC from Affiliating Body at the time of submission of application is a new concept envisaged in the above said Regulations as in the previous Regulations, they were to obtain affiliation after recognition of the programme by NCTE and as such the Affiliating Bodies had no choice but to grant affiliation because they were mandated under Section 16 of NCTE Act to do so. In the new regulations, scope has been created to involve the Affiliating Bodies in the recognition process at the very beginning when application is submitted to the Regional Committee of NCTE.

4. Being a new concept of obtaining NOC from the Affiliating Body at the time of application, it appears the State Governments have not felt the urgency at this stage to issue necessary instructions to all the Affiliating Bodies for conveying their NOC for the new Teacher Education Programmes and therefore, the institutions who wish to apply for the Teacher Education Programmes are finding it difficult to get NOC from the Affiliating Bodies.

5. Although, as you may be aware, the NCTE has already held orientation workshops region wise throughout the country with the Universities / SCERTs etc., for sharing and clarifying the provisions in the new Regulations so as to pave the way for seamless transition from the old to the new Regulations but for more clarity and sensitizing the stakeholders, the regional offices of NCTE are in the process of holding another one day round table meeting (region wise) in this month with the State Government officers / State Universities / SCERTs etc. My regional office will approach you separately.

6. In view of the above, I seek your cooperation and request you to issue necessary instructions to all the Affiliating Bodies in the State to grant NOC to the institutions who wish to apply for the Teacher Education Programmes, so that the applications are submitted within the prescribed time frame. It is pertinent to mention here that the time schedule for inviting and acceptance of applications is in pursuance of the orders of Hon'ble Supreme Court and therefore, NCTE has no say to extend the same.

Subject: National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2014 - Regarding Implementation.

Dear Sir/Madam,

The National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), a statutory body set up by an Act of Parliament in 1993, has the mandate to ensure planned and coordinated development of Teacher Education in the country, for which it lays down Norms and Standards for the recognition of various teacher education programmes (including TE programmes of universities). The Recognition Norms are revised periodically to meet the changing needs of the teacher education system in response to the new demands of the society in general and of the education system in particular.

At the instance of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Government of India appointed a Commission on Teacher Education under the Chairmanship of Justice J.S. Verma in 2011 to rejuvenate the system of teacher education in the country. The Commission made several recommendations relating to duration and curriculum of various teacher education programmes, and also about the qualifications and preparation of Teacher Educators responsible for conducting teacher education programmes in recognised teacher education institutions. In order to implement the recommendations of the Commission, the NCTE was required to revise the Regulations and the Norms & Standards of the existing programmes and formulate Norms & Standards in respect of new programmes if any.

On the basis of sustained deliberations among educationists and nation-wide consultations with stakeholders, the NCTE has published Regulations and Norms & Standards in respect of 15 teacher education programmes vide Gazette notification No. 346 dated 01.12.2014, a copy of which is enclosed for your perusal. The New Regulations and Norms & Standards have come into force from the date of their publication in the Gazette of India.

Out of 15 Programmes included in the above mentioned Notification, the following programmes, being part of the higher education system, come under the jurisdiction of the universities:

1. Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.El.Ed.)
2. Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.)
3. Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) through ODL Mode
4. Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.Ed.)
5. Master of Education (M.Ed.)
6. Master of Physical Education (M.P.Ed.)
7. BA B.Ed./BSc.B.Ed. integrated Programme of 4- Years' duration
8. Integrated B.Ed.-M.Ed. programme of 3 Years' duration
9. B.Ed. (Part-time) Programme of 3 Years' duration
