PART-TIME COURSE CERTIFICATE COURSE IN CHINESE LANGUAGE Course In-Charge: Ms. Saheli Chattaraj

This is an introductory course in Mandarin Chinese designed for students whose native language is not Chinese and who do not speak or read Mandarin Chinese.

Course Structure and Goals

The Course focuses on speaking and writing of Mandarin Chinese. Students learn the basic tones, sentence structures and grammatical rules and writing of the Chinese characters following the strokes and the stroke orders. On completion of the course, students are able to acquire a vocabulary of 1000 words used in basic conversation. Course texts are written in Pinyin (the transliteration system for Chinese characters) and Chinese characters. This allows the students to focus on their communication skills, both speaking and comprehension and also their basic Chinese character writing skills. The class shall meet twice a week and the students shall be required to complete the home assignments after each lesson.

Eligibility

Students who have qualified 10+2 with a minimum percentage of 45% are eligible to get enrolled for the course. This course is for students whose native language is not Mandarin Chinese and who do not speak or read Mandarin Chinese. A written test and an interview shall be conducted for the admission procedure according to University rules.

Learning Outcome

At the end of the Course the student will

- Have acquired a vocabulary of 1000 basic Chinese words that shall enable them to conduct basic conversations
- Know all the Chinese tones which are crucial for their pronunciation
- Be able to construct simple sentences in Chinese using the basic grammatical structures
- Be familiar with the Pinyin transliteration system used to transliterate Chinese

Duration

The class shall meet twice a week; duration of each class shall be of three hours.

Evaluation

Classroom attendance (minimum 75%) and performance, a midterm exam and a final exam (Both written and Oral)

A student needs to attain 40 percentage marks in both the written and the oral exam in order to successfully qualify.

PART-TIME COURSE DIPLOMA COURSE IN CHINESE LANGUAGE Course In-Charge: Ms. Saheli Chattaraj

This is an intermediate level course in Mandarin Chinese designed for students whose are already familiar with the basic spoken and writing skills in Mandarin Chinese and have already acquired knowledge of the basic vocabulary in the beginner's level

Course Structure and Goals

The Course focuses on the practice and learning the use of new vocabulary, use role-playing to conduct dialogues, ability to deliver and understand Chinese expressions and nuances for the day to day usage. As with the previous level Certificate Course, this Diploma Course further increases the scope of mastering a vocabulary of 3000 words and improves the students' use of grammatical structures. The class shall meet twice a week and the students shall be required to complete the home assignments after each lesson.

Eligibility

Students who have successfully completed a Certificate Course in Chinese Language and can conduct a basic conversation in Chinese. A written test and an interview shall be conducted for the admission procedure according to University rules.

Learning Outcome

At the end of the Course the student will

- Be able to communicate in Chinese fluently
- Be able to use the Chinese language in an appropriate way in various specific Chinese cultural situations
- Be able to use and practice a variety of Chinese idioms and set phrases

Duration

The class shall meet twice a week; duration of each class shall be of two hours.

Evaluation

Classroom attendance (minimum) and performance, a midterm exam and a final exam (Both written and Oral)

A student needs to attain 40 percentage marks in both the written and the oral exam in order to successfully qualify.

PART-TIME COURSE CERTIFICATE IN UZBEK LANGUAGE Course In-Charge: Dr. Shahid Tasleem

Introduction

For the First time in India a Certificate Course in Uzbek language is being offered by the Academy of International Studies. The growing political relation between India and Central Asian Countries, particularly Uzbekistan, have necessitated India's diplomats, scholars academicians, businessmen to acquaint themselves with the people, culture and the language of these countries. Historically, the people of both India and the Central Asian region had a very close relation. For these reasons the AIS has a very close relation, for these reasons the AIS has started this course from the academic session 2004-05.

Objective of the Course

To train student, research, scholars, academicians. Businessmen and general public interested in Central Asia, especially Uzbekistan, to speak the language. The course is oriented towards basic skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing. The course is being offered at the AIS since July 2004.

Syllabus

Script (old and new), pronunciation of alphabet, vowels, consonants. Nouns and Pronouns: singular plural, simple declension, verbs: simple present past, future, Formation of simple sentences: affirmative, negative, and interrogative. Adjectives and adverbs. Prepositions and 'postpositions.' The course will also pay extra attention to the development of conversational skills. This will include a focus on vocabulary which will cover the following areas:

- a) Speech etiquette
- b) Formal/ Informal greetings
- c) Naming of food items, months, seasons, day of the week, part of the body, household items, professions etc.
- d) Expressions required for travelling, eating at a restaurant, speech etiquette on formal occasions, such as meetings etc.
- e) Different expressions of time

PART-TIME COURSE DIPLOMA IN UZBEK LANGUAGE Course In-Charge: Dr. Shahid Tasleem

This is an advanced and intensive course in Uzbek Language. It will be open to all India and foreign students, research scholars, academician, diplomats businessmen and general public, interested in central Asia, especially Uzbekistan whose mother tongue is not Uzbek and who already have the basic rudimentary knowledge of the Uzbek language. This course is also open to candidates sponsored by the Govt. Of India and those working under different Programmers approved by the Govt. of India.

Aims and Objectives

- The course is oriented towards four basic skills, namely listening, speaking, reading, and writing at an advanced level.
- To enhance the knowledge of the student in the basic understanding of Uzbek language in different social contexts, with which he/ she is already familiar.

Syllabus

1. Oral language skills (speaking and comprehension)

The course deals with oral skills on the level of language production, i.e. speaking, hearing and comprehension. It concentrates on improving the listening sensitivity, and developing the ability of the student to comprehend and reproduce Uzbek sound and sentence patterns as close to the native level as possible. Special attention is paid to distinctive consonantal features, such as aspiration, retro –Flexion, and to prosodic feature like Street feature, intonation etc. The paper is designed to help the student master the salient features of Uzbek Phonology and grammar, and encourage the creative reproduction of language structures through topical and free conversation.

2. Written language skills

The course is designed to train the student to read and understand texts of current Uzbek usage including phrases and idiomatic expression found in literary writings. It also aims at training the student in learning different writing style in order to write composition and essays. The reading material has been selected keeping in view the requirements of understanding the cultural overtones of the language.

i) Comprehension

- ii) Translation from Uzbek into English / Hindi / Urdu
- iii) Summary of lessons prescribed in the syllabus
- iv) Critical apperception of stories prescribed in the syllabus
- v) Short note on Uzbek Writers/ Poets prescribed in the syllabus
- vi) Composition (Descriptive)

3. Uzbek Grammar Structure and Usage (including composition and translation)

The course aims at making the student proficient in his/her control of Uzbek language mechanism, which hi/she has already learnt. The course covers structural patterns on different level usage. Sufficient attention is given to the potential zones of linguistics code interference between the target (Uzbek) and the source (English) language, construction peculiar to Uzbek, different level of honorifics, direct and obliges forms, passives, casual dilation of nominals. Construction with conjunctions and compound verbs. Attention is given to Uzbek- English and English-Uzbek Translation work. Composition is done as part of the home assignment, while explanation of corrections from a part of the classroom assignment.

- i) Prepositions, gender, numbers, participles and verb endings.
- ii) Tenses & moods: Past, Present and Future
- iii) Formation of compound verbs
- iv) Composition (Descriptive)
- v) Conversation
- vi) Special focus on Uzbek culture and literature
- vii) Formal and informal writing
- viii) Translation from Uzbek to English & vice versa
- ix) Interpretation

PART-TIME COURSE KYRGYZ LANGUAGE COURSE

Taking into consideration the growing interest to Central Asia, particularly Kyrgyzstan, the Academy of Third World Studies proposes to start the new course "Kyrgyz Studies" to teach the history, culture and language of Kyrgyzstan. The proposed "Kyrgyz Studies" course aims to teach basic Kyrgyz language and also to teach about the traditions, customs, history and culture of Kyrgyzstan. The course consists of two parts:

- i) Practical Language Course
- ii) Lecture Course on History and Culture

Unit-wise Time Allotment

Course Content (Syllabus)

I. *Grammar:* Vowel and Consonant, Alphabet, the forms of treatment, simple, compound and pair-words. Sentence: simple, statement, interrogative, exclamatory, affirmative, negative.

Noun: Singular and Plural, Declension.

Verb: Simple present, Past, Future Tenses, Indicative, negative form.

Adjective: Simple, Compund, Degrees of comparison. Pronoun: Personal, Demonstrative, Possessive, Interrogative Numeral: Collective, Partitive, Approximative Postpositions, Conjunctions Antonym, Synonym, Homonym, Interjection

The course will also pay extra attention to the development of conversational skills. This will include the building of vocabulary needed for simple conversations in everyday situations. The vocabulary will cover the following areas:

- Speech etiquette
- Formal/informal greetings
- Naming of food items, months, seasons, days of the weeks, parts of the body, household items, professions
- Different expressions of time

II. *Lecture Course*: Country profile, Language and History, Spiritual and Material Culture, Customs and Traditions, Folklore and Literature, Fine and Applied Art, National Cuisine, Games, the epos "Manas", Historical Events.

Test and Examinations

The final examination will consist of two papers: Paper I. A written paper (Kyrgyz language, Grammar and Translation) Paper II. A Viva Voce

Paper I: A written paper (maximum marks 100) of 3 hours duration

- Translation of one passage into English from a specified or unspecified Kyrgyz text (30 marks):
- A passage in Kyrgyz for comprehension and questions (20 marks)
- Questions on Grammar (20 marks)
- Translation of seen and unseen passages in Kyrgyz into English (30 marks)

Paper II: Viva Voce (maximum marks 100)

- Conversation (40 marks)
- Reading of a passage from a prescribes Kyrgyz text (30 marks)
- Questions on culture and history of Kyrgyzsatan
- to be answered in English (30 marks)
