INTRODUCTION

Arabic in Jamia Millia Islamia has been one of the subjects which were introduced at the under graduate level at the earliest stage. However, its teaching at postgraduate level started in 1976 as one of the three disciplines of the erstwhile Department of Islamic & Arab-Iranian Studies. The Department of Arabic as an independent unit was established only in 1988. At present the Department conducts different courses such as B.A. (Pass) and Honours, M.A. and Part-Time evening courses namely Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma in Modern Arabic. Besides, it also enrolls scholars for Ph. D. Course on variety of subjects relevant to Arabic language and literature. Till date, 21 scholars have been awarded Ph. D. Degree.

One of the unique features of the courses designed for various levels of study is the special thrust on the need to create considerable efficiency in writing and speaking in Arabic among the students. Translation/Interpretation from English into Arabic and vice-versa is another aspect which is given special attention at various levels of teaching.

THE UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS (Relevant extracts from Ordinance X)

Attendance (for Regular Students)

2.1 A Candidate shall be deemed to have under-gone a regular course of study in the University, if he/she has attended at least 75% in the aggregate of lectures, tutorials and practicals in order to be eligible to appear at the Examination. Provided that the Majlis-i- Talimi (Academic Council) may, in special circumstances, condone any shortage in such attendance except otherwise provided by the Academic Council.

2.2 A relaxation to the maximum extent of 15% of the total attendance shall be accorded to student on account of sickness, participation in university functions and the prescribed Educational Tours Field Trips Field work provided that the attendance record, duly counter signed by the Teacher incharge, is sent to the Head of the Department concerned/Principal, University Polytechnic within two weeks of the function/activity etc.

Provided further in case of sickness/medical disability an application for the condonation shall be supported by a medical certificate issued by a registered Medical Practitioner/Public Hospital and duly authenticated by the Ansari Health Centre of JMI Such applications-must be submitted either during the period of treatment/hospitalisation or within two weeks following recovery.

12. Time limit for passing an Examination

No person shall be allowed to appear in the Examination after the expiry of the periods specified against each Course, noted below:

20. Grace Marks:

If the Examination Committee considers it necessary, it may award grace marks on the following pattern:

20.1 A maximum of three (3) grace marks in all Courses of the University. Provided that the system of awarding grace marks shall not be applicable to Courses, where grades are awarded.

20.2 Grace marks shall be given only to those candidates, who by obtaining them are able to either pass the Examination or secure a Compartment or granting the divisions. The award of grace marks shall be at the discretion of the Examination Committee and no appeal in this regard shall be entertained.

20.3 Only minimum grace marks, as required to pass the Examination or to secure a Compartment, shall be awarded.

20.4 The grace marks awarded shall not be counted in computing the percentage or Grand total or aggregate.

21. Improvement of the Division:

(i) Unless otherwise provided, a candidate will be allowed to appear at the Examination to improve upon his/her performance in the Examination held in the preceding year.

(ii) If a candidate appears at the Examination in order to improve upon his/her previous marks of the same Subject/Paper, higher marks as obtained in his/her two such Examinations shall be taken into account for determination of his/her final result.

(iii) A candidate desiring to improve his/her Percentage of Marks will have to submit an application to the Controller of Examinations latest by 15th September of the Year in which he/she passed the Subject/Paper, or as notified by the Controller of Examinations.

(iv) To improve upon the Division or Percentage of Marks, a candidate maybe allowed to appear at the next Annual Examination only in Paper (s) concerned.

(v) The syllabus of the Examination will be the same as the one prescribed for the year, when the candidate appeared at the Examination in the Paper concerned.

21 A. Students of Class B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. (Pass/Hons)/B.C.A., B.B.S., B.I.B.F., B.Sc. Instrumentation, M.A/MSc./M.S.S./M.Sc. (Elect.)/ M.Com./M.Ed./LL.B. applying for improvement in one paper not more than once.

21A.1 A student may appear for improvement in any paper in next higher class only without any break/gap in study of the course i.e. a first year paper can be improved in the second year only, not in

21A.2 (i) The Ist year arid IInd year students of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com (pass/Hons), B.C.A., B.B.S., B.I.B.F, B.Sc.Instrumentation & LL.B. and M.A./M.Sc./ M.Com / M.S.S/M.Sc.(Elect.) both previous and Final shall be allowed to appear for improvement only at the time of Annual Examination. In case of M.S.S./M.Sc.(Electronics), the improvement for the paper(s) of I & II semester shall be allowed along with the III & IV semester, respectively.

(ii) Final year students B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. (Pass/Hons)/B.C.A.,B.B.S., B.I.B.F., LL.B., standard X and standard XII may be allowed to attempt improvement along with the Comptt. Examinations.

21A.3 The better of the two marks obtained by a student in both attempts will be considered as final and conclusive.

In case of students who apply for improvement but do not appear in paper/papers their previous marks in the said paper/papers shall be counted. 21 A.4 (i) If a student of final year desires to appear for improvement at the time of the next Annual Examination, he will not be granted admission to a higher class.

(ii) Students who have already secured admission on the basis of their unimproved marks are eligible to appear for improvement at the time of Comptt. examination only where improvement is permitted along with comptt. examination as per rule 2(b) above.

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21A.5 The student will have to appear in the improvement examination on the basis of the current syllabus in the same paper. However if the paper has been changed (Title and contents) then the student would appear as per the old syllabus of the paper.

21A.6 No chance for improvement in the practical, Field work, Viva-voce, sessional, internal Assessment and Dissertation will be given.

22. Retotalling of Answer Scripts:

22.1 The marks of the candidate shall be retotalled on an application received from the candidate on payment of the prescribed fee per Paper. The above Fee will be refunded, if the total is found to be incorrect.

22.2 No application for retotalling shall be entertained, unless it is made within fifteen days of the publication of the result.

23. Re-Evaluation of Answer Script:

23.1 (i) Any candidate, intending to apply for re-evaluation of answer scripts (s) of any Paper/Subject of his/her written Examination, may do so on the prescribed Application Form within 15 days from the date of issue of marks sheet.

(ii) The re-evaluation of scripts will not be allowed in more than one third of written Papers of an Annual Examination.

23.2 Each application for re-evaluation shall be accompanied by the original Statement of Marks issued to the candidate.

23.3 Re-evaluation shall not be permitted in the case of Practical Examinations, viva voce, Project Report, Sessionals/Internal Assessment and Dissertation, as also the answer scripts of any Examination which have already been valued in full by Joint Examiners/Board of Examiners.

23.4 The candidate applying for re-evaluation shall be required to pay the prescribed Fee per Paper or part thereof; No refund shall be made in any case except if marks increased more than 20%, in a paper/subject.

23.5 The Controller of Examinations will select an Examiner for revaluation from amongst a panel of at least three Examiners in each paper

recommended by the Board of Studies. The said panel shall exclude the name of the initial examiner.

23.6 The merit list, declared in the results of the respective Examination shall not be prejudiced owing to re-evaluation of scripts.

23.7 If there be any change in the result of the Examination due to reevaluation of answer scripts, no examinee can complain in the Court of Law, nor any action can be initiated against the Examiner (s) concerned.

23.8 (i) I f the award of the Re-evaluator (second Examiner) varies from the original award up to and including + -5% of the maximum marks secured earlier, the original award shall stand.

(ii) If the award of the Re-evaluator varies from the original award up to and including

-+20% of the maximum marks secured earlier, then the answer script shall be sent to the second re-evaluator (Third Examiner).

(iii) The average of the marks awarded by the Second and Third Examiners shall be final.

23.9 All cases of re-evaluation of scripts shall be repolled to the Examination Committee.

23.10 Applications for re-evaluation of answer scripts only for Annual Examination shall be accepted.

23.11 Answer scripts of those examinees who appeared for improvement of division or Percentage of Marks shall be final and shall not be subject to re-evaluation.

(b) Division:

(i) B.A./B.Sc. (Pass): Division shall be assigned to the successful candidates on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained in Parts I, II and III Examinations by the candidate in the Optional Subject and General English. For B.Sc. (Pass) the division will be assigned only of the aggregate marks obtained in Science Subject.

A candidate who is declared passed and obtained the required percentage of marks in the aggregate, shall be placed in the following Division. 75% of marks or more in Paper(s)

There will be no compartmental exam for Part I & II.

A candidate who has not passed the B.A. B.Sc. (Pass), Part III, Examination, but has secured not less than 33% of marks in at least one of the Optional Subject and at least 25% of marks in the aggregate of Optional Subjects of Part III, will be permitted to appear at the Compartmental Examination in those Papers in which he/she has not secured at least 33% of marks. Candidates who have passed all papers of Part I/II and III but not secured required aggregate, shall be permitted to appear after following Compartmental exams in those two papers of Part III in which he/she secure lowest marks,

Candidates who fail to clear their paper(s) of Part I/II and passed all papers of Part III or get compartment in Part III will be allowed to clear those papers at the next Compartmental exam only once. After that they will be permitted to appear in the annual examination only.

(ii) B.A./B. Sc./B. Com. (Hons.)/B.C.A./B.B.S./B.I.B.F./ B.Sc. Instrumentation, Part I, II, III:

There will be no compartmental exam for Part I & II.

A candidate of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(Hons.)/BCA/BBS/BIBF Part III Examination will be permitted to appear at the Compartmental Examination in those Papers in which he/she has not secured at least 36% of marks, if he/she fails in the papers noted below:

B.A./B.Sc. (Hons.) /B.Sc. Instrumentation Part I/II.

(Other than B.A. (Hons.) in Social Work) Passing in at least one of the subjects (Main or Subsidiary) and securing at least 25% marks in the aggregate (Main and Subsidiary Subjects).

B.A. / B.Sc./ B.Com: (Hons) /BCA/BBS/BIBF/ B.Sc. Instrumentation Part III and B.A. (Hons.) in Social work, Part I/II/III.

Failing in any three Papers, of Part III securing at least 25% in the aggregate.

Candidates who fail to clear their paper(s) of Part I/II and passed all papers of Part III or get compartment in Part III will be allowed to clear those papers at the next Compartmental exam only once. After that they will be permitted to appear in the annual examination only.

(iii) The Pass percentage in the Compartmental Examination will be the same as stated above.

(iv) An eligible candidate, who does not appear or fails at the Compartmental Examination, may appear at the next Annual Examination as an Ex-Student and will pass all the Papers he/she was required to pass at the previous Compartmental Examination.

Note: (1) If there is only one Paper in a Subject in any year, the Paper shall be treated as a Subject.

(2) For the purpose of placing a candidate in the Compartmental Examination, the performance in Compulsory Subjects will not be considered. But a candidate has to obtain qualifying mark in Compulsory subjects for the award of the Degree.

(3) Practical Examination or Dissertation/Projector Viva- Voce Examination will not be held again, if the candidate has secured at least passing marks in his/her earlier Examination.

(d) A student of Ist year of any Course who is detained due to shortage of attendance will no longer remain the student of the faculty/department. Such student will have to seek fresh admission and will be required to go through entire process of admission and competition.

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
