JMI organizes training seminars for the faculty members of Kabul-based Universities

The Nelson Mandela Centre for Peace and Conflict Resolution, JMI, in collaboration with the Centre for Afghanistan Studies (CAS), University of Nebraska at Omaha, with the support of "University Support Workforce Development Program" funded by USAID is conducting two training seminars for the faculty members of Kabul University, Balkh University, and Kabul Polytechnic University at Jamia Millia Islamia for the duration of eleven days starting December 28, 2016 and ending on January 7, 2017.
