JMI student participates in Commonwealth Youth Summit held in Malaysia

Kuldeep Bhattacharya, a second year MA student from the MMAJ-Academy of International Studies of Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI) participated at a two-day Conference organized by the Royal Commonwealth Society in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia which discussed means of combating terrorism and promoting international peace and cooperation.

Representatives from Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Brunei, Malaysia and Singapore apart from India attended the 'Commonwealth Youth Dialogue Conference: Youth Summit on International Peace and Security and Building Community Resilience from the Ground Up' from 2 to 5 April 2019.
