## JMI organises webinar on Social Vulnerability and Health Equity-Emerging Issues of Access and Utilization in the times of Covid-19

The Department of Geography, Jamia Millia Islamia(JMI) organised a webinar on 'Social Vulnerability and Health Equity-Emerging Issues of Access and Utilization in the times of Covid-19'. Prof. Sanghamitra Sheel Acharya from Centre for Social Medicine and Community Health, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University(JNU) was the main speaker in the webinar.
