Special screening of documentary film 'Chaitybhumi' at JMI to commemorate 134th birth anniversary of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar

The Centre for the Study of Social Inclusion (CSSI) at Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI) hosted a commemorative screening of the renowned documentary "Chaitybhumi," directed by esteemed filmmaker Somnath Waghmare, in honor of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's 134th birth anniversary. This event, aimed at promoting equitable and inclusive education, took place on April 9, 2025, and was broadcast live on various social media platforms. It was accessible to all CSSI centers across India, as well as the University Grants Commission (UGC). Following the guidance of UGC Secretary Prof. Manish R. Dr. Ambedkar, often called as the father of Indian Constitution, dedicated his life to fighting the chains of caste oppression and bringing revolutionary change. This musical film aims to bring to light the history and cultural politics of how people commemorate December 6 at Chaitybhumi, Mumbai and the relevance of this public event in contemporary India. It explores how Dalit community comes together to honour this day and its political implications for their identity and empowerment.

The event commenced at 2:00 PM with a warm welcome to the dignitaries and guests by the Hony. Director, Prof.Tanuja followed by a formal introduction of the film's Director and Chief Guest of the event Mr. Somnath Waghmare, by Dr. Arvind Kumar,

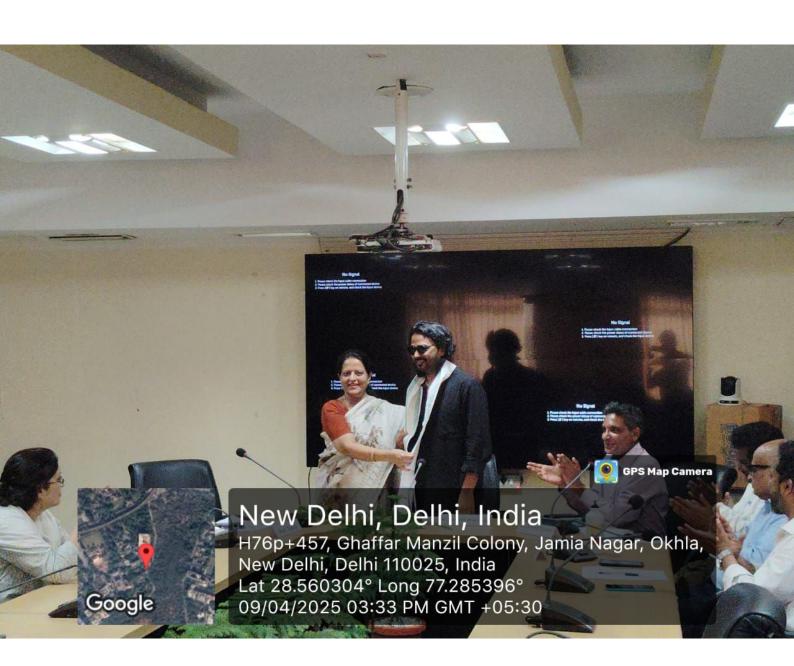

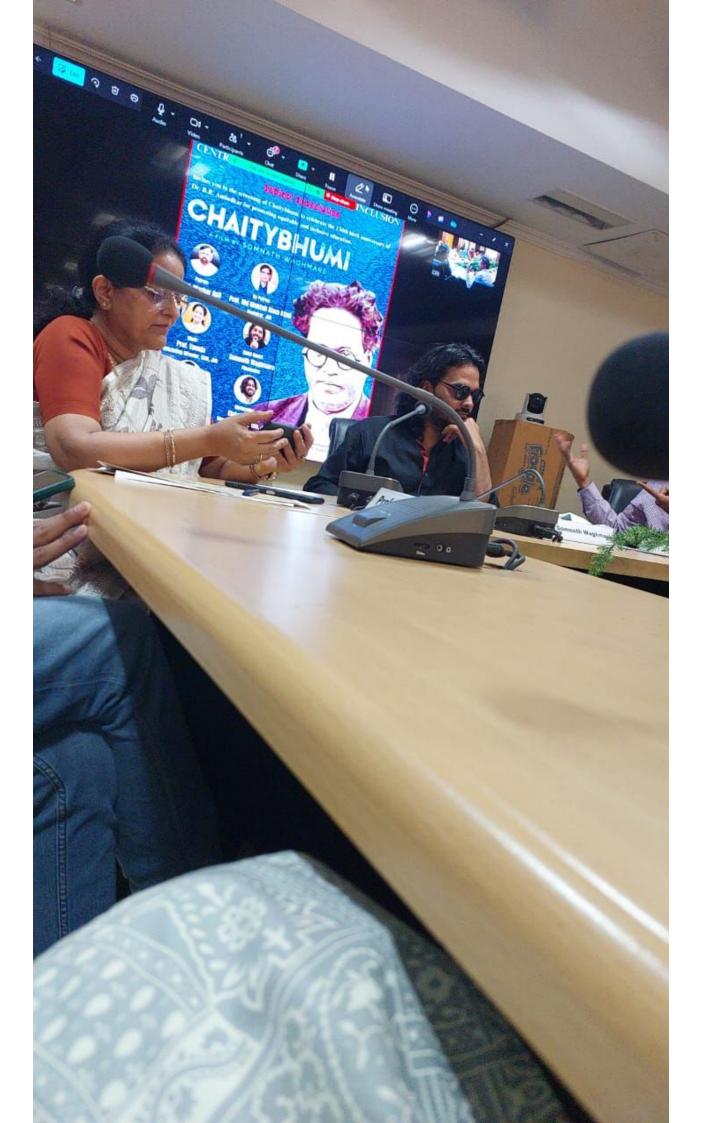

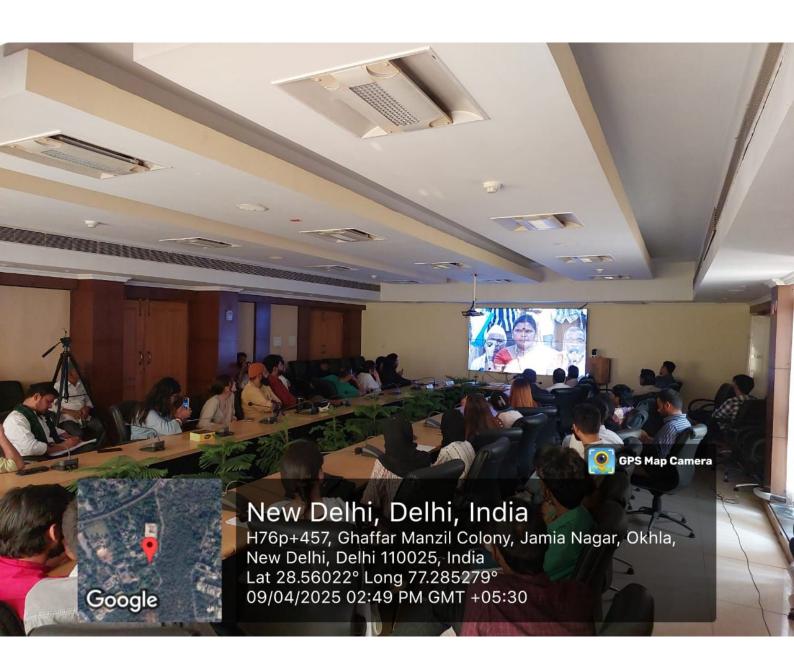
